

# 2015 In Projects

- \* 2015 was a year of exciting change
- \* Lots of new projects, initiatives
- \* Many projects struggled
- \* However, many projects also succeeded

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# **Themes of Struggling Projects**

- 1. Lack of / inadequate Requirements Review
- 2. Lack of / inadequate Stakeholder Engagement
- 3. Lack of / inadequate Risk Management
- 4. Use of new Technology or Delivery Approach without adequate analysis
- 5. Frequently Missed Deadlines
- 6. Heavy losses billions of dollars



# **Themes of Successful Projects**

### 1. Solid Planning

- Stakeholder Analysis
- Scope, Cost and Schedule
- Risk Management
- 2. Tighter Execution
- 3. Commitment to quality
- 4. Regular/Continuous commitment of project team
- 5. Thorough testing
- 6. Incorporating lessons learned from other projects

# **SR99 Highway Tunnel Project**

- \* Largest tunnel-building machine for Seattle's Highway 99
  - ✓ \$1.35 billion contract awarded to "Bertha"
  - To build about 2 miles, 4 lane tunnel under downtown Seattle
  - ✓ Awarded in March 2010, with a completion date of Dec 2015

#### \* Current State

- ✓ % complete is disputable 11% to 75%
- ✓ Over \$900 million spent, not sure if it will be completed within budget
- Completion date moved several times
- The current completion date is April 2018 ~ 2+ years late

#### \* Major Issue

- ✓ Stalled due to overheating December 2013
- ✓ Repairs still going on
- Bertha may restart on Dec 23, 2015

# Why Did The Project Struggle?

- ∗ Large project with high complexity
  ✓ Lots of small parts and break points
  ✓ Repair required digging a pit and driving the machine in
- \* Risk of new technology / approach
   ✓ Building one big tunnel vs. smaller twin tunnels
- ∗ Issue affected critical path of project
   ✓ Team had to continue work in other areas
   ✓ Most work depends on Bertha digging the tunnel



# **Target Canada**





### **Target Canada**

- \* From March 2013 to 2015, opened 133 stores quickly
- \* Supply chain could not keep stores stocked
- \* Customers did not show up
- \* Target closed all Canadian stores starting January 2015

### Losses could exceed \$7 billion

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# Why Did The Project Struggle?

#### \* Failure to live up to customer expectations

- "Expect more, pay less" Target slogan was not met with
- Canadian prices were higher than US prices
- Customers did not find what they needed, when they needed (supply chain issue)

#### \* Lack of stakeholder analysis

- Lack of situational awareness
- ✓ Failure to fully understand Canadian retail sector

#### \* Plan not realistic

Too many stores opened too quickly

#### \* Inadequate risk management

- Too many stores opened too quickly will supply chain support it?
- What was the backup if customers did not show?





# **David Bowie Installation**

- \* "David Bowie Is" installation
  - Museum of Contemporary Art in Chicago
- \* Exhibit devoted to the popular singer's life and work
- Ran from September 2014 to January 2015
   ✓ Project started in August 2013 project duration 17 months
- \* Visited by over 193,000
  - In 4 months

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# Why Did The Project Succeed?

#### Solid project planning


- ✓ All challenges were identified upfront, PM and the team was fully aware
  - Managing a very large budget, securing buy-in from visitors and funders and handling the ticketing and spatial logistics
- Project team took lessons learned from other museums especially Toronto museum that ran the exhibit in the past – bigger crowd came in the evenings.
- Outsourced online ticketing system to handle the high demand
- ✓ Museum CFO was included in the "Team Bowie" to keep a check on project budget
- ✓ Risks were identified and managed throughout the project duration

#### \* Excellent project execution

- "Team Bowie" met every week for 13 months
- Project team dedicated itself to stringent testing for "Bowie Crush" over 200 team members crammed in to test crowd control
- Success metrics were tracked throughout the exhibit, changes were applied on the fly to improve success metrics



# Konza Techno City in Kenya

# Konza Techno City

#### \* Planned technology center outside of Nairobi, Kenya

- ✓ \$14.5 billion dollar project, a flagship initiative in Vision 2030.
- Planned to be more advanced in terms of sustainability and technology
- Silicon Savanna similar to Silicon City
- Expected to grow over next 20 years
- Attract over 200,000 IT jobs to Kenya

#### \* Current Status

- Road construction has started
- Kenya Power has started laying power lines
- Govt. backed authority is overseeing the project, infrastructure components will be accomplished through public-private partnership
- Challenges are being handled in a proactive manner.

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# Why Is The Project Succeeding?

#### \* Master plan in place

Allows project managers to keep project goal at the forefront

#### \* Phase-based approach gives them time to

- Address challenges like funding, timelines and investors,
- Make changes as needed, already had to redesign water/sanitation subproject to meet the city's needs of 100 million liters/day.

#### \* Sustainability

✓ Building in safeguards for local wildlife (2.4 sq. mile corridor)



# **Key Lessons from 2015**

- Fundamentals are still important
- Always keep the stakeholders in mind
- Look for lessons learned when trying something new
- Essential processes can achieve big results



# **Fundamentals**

- \* Project management fundamentals are still important
- \* Projects succeeded or failed due to:
  - Clarity of scope/requirements
  - ✓ Stakeholder analysis
  - Communication
  - ✓ Quality control
  - ✓ Risk management



### **Remember Stakeholders**

- \* Stakeholder analysis is critically important
- \* Helps gain necessary support and resources
- \* Prevents future problems

#### Target Canada team did not think about stakeholders



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## **Seeking Lessons Learned**

- \* When trying something new, look for examples
- \* David Bowie project team learned from other museums
- \* "Bertha" team could have learned lessons elsewhere

### \* Look for:

- Examples of similar projects
- Company lessons learned database
- Historical information



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#### **Essential Processes Can Achieve Big Results**

- \* Strong project charter and risk management have helped Konza Technology City
- Strong communication, reporting, and risk management helped the David Bowie project
- Bertha project could have benefitted from better risk management, scheduling
- \* Target Canada project could have benefitted from better risk management, stakeholder management
