Retrospectives

* "An Agile Retrospective is a meeting that is held at the end of a iteration in the Agile Software Development. During the retrospective, the team reflects on what happened in the iteration and identifies actions moving forward."


"A retrospective is an opportunity for the participants to learn how to improve. The focus is on learning, not fault-finding." Norm Kerth

Basic outcome of Retrospective:

- * Three basic questions are asked to everyone in a Retrospective:
 - ✓ What went well?
 - ✓ What did not go well and could be improved?
 - √ What action should be taken to improve?

What are Retrospectives?

- * Meeting of the team to reflect after each iteration/sprint
- * Purpose of the retrospective is to inspect & adapt:
 - 1. What went well during the sprint?
 - 2. What could have gone better?
 - 3. What actions can we take to improve in the next sprint?
- * Team records their thoughts and generates insights



Benefits of Retrospective

When the team conducts a good retrospective, following positive outcomes are normally expected:

- ✓ Ability to develop and deliver software steadily improves
- √ Team grows closer and more cohesive
- More transparency among team members, which helps team members understand and respect issues other team members face
- √ Honest and open about success and failure
- ✓ More comfortable and flexible towards positive change.

Agile Retrospective Duration				
If my sprint is this long	My retrospective should last			
One week	45 minutes			
Two weeks	1.5 hours			
Three weeks	2.25 hours			
Four weeks	3 hours			
These are general guidelines. Retrospectives can be run in as little as 30 minutes.

How to adapt to a Waterfall team?

- * Hold lessons learned several times during the project
 - √ Lessons learned at the end are no longer actionable
 - √ Team may not see any value for lessons learned at the end
 - ✓ On the other hand, lessons learned during the project can be immediately applied
- * Provides an opportunity to collect regular feedback from team and stakeholders
- * Implement knowledge management to track feedback

How to do it efficiently?

- * In first five minutes;
 - Everyone writes their ideas on sticky note pads about what went well, what did not, and action items.
 - One idea on one sticky note pad.
 - Put their Stickies on the wall
- * In next 10-20 minutes;
 - They gather around the wall and discuss the Stickies, and
 - Identify 1-2 action items that they are going to implement in the next sprint/iteration.





That's all - 30 minutes and you are done!


