Large, Distributed Team To Agile Machine





Large & Distributed Team Defined

- A team is large team if it has more than 20 team members
- A team is distributed where not all members are co-located at one place

Managing a team that is both large and distributed is challenging

Overcoming the Challenges

- Manage time and cultural differences by splitting teams by same geography / time zone / culture
- Increase coordinating / collaborating by implementing a governance model
- Develop infrastructure/tools/systems/processes by bringing in simple, incremental improvements
- Split larger teams into smaller teams by above criteria (time/culture) and others as appropriate



Why Split Teams?

- Ideal Agile team size is 7 plus or minus 2
 - √20+ person teams face lot of coordination issues
 - √ Splitting into squads helps them self-manage
- Splitting by time zone helps lessen pain
 - ✓ Eliminates need for some squad members to meet past their normal work hours
 - ✓ It also helps in reducing the miscommunication or confusions caused due to cultural differences




Why Governance?

- More teams means more coordination
 - ✓ More support and oversight is needed
- More teams means more governance
 - √ Work output is harder to consolidate and synchronize




Governance Model for Smaller Co-Located Teams



Team Social Contract

- Social contract should:
 - Apply uniformly for each squad
 - Set firm standards for dos/don'ts and values, agreements, and ground rules
 - E.g. "DO attend daily standup at 8:30 AM Central" vs. "DON'T set any meetings from 12:00 noon-8:00 PM Central"
 - Another example: "DO be on time for all videoconferences and share your webcam, DON'T take mobile phone calls during the meeting
- The purpose is to build team and squad cohesion



Team Social Contract Example

Values – the concepts we adhere to

- Honesty we are forthcoming about our progress and our capacity.
- Integrity we say what we mean and mean what we say to ourselves and the customer.
- Sustainability we timebox work to our core hours and use overtime only when necessary.

Agreements – the commitments we've made based on these values

- We will define and adhere to a definition of "done" for everything we deliver.
- We will define timeboxes for our work and our meetings and respect the timeboxes.
- We will respect each other and our abilities and manage conflicts as they arise.

Ground Rules – the norms we've set based on these agreements

- It is your responsibility to ensure acceptance criteria are met. Reach out if you have questions.
- Don't schedule a meeting over an existing meeting.
- One person talks at a time during meetings so everyone can contribute.
- Be on time for each meeting.
- 5. If you are on videoconference, be ready to share your webcam.
- Try to manage any conflicts directly and escalate if you cannot.






