#1 - Lack of face-to-face interaction

	Symptoms	How to Overcome
1.	Body language and visual cues offer important insights that are often lost in virtual interactions	 Use videoconferencing whenever possible to preserve team members' faces and mannerisms
2.	Without this information, misunderstanding is more likely, leading to missed requirements and greater conflict potential	 Create opportunities to meet in person wherever feasible for important milestones – or celebrate later once meeting is feasible
3.	Can especially affect hybrid teams if co-located team members are getting information that others are not	3. Use information radiators to make sure everyone has the same information



#2 – Low engagement

Symptoms		How to Overcome	
1.	If whole team is not focused and some people are not engaging, then meetings may be disrupted	1.	Use a team charter or social contract and ask everyone to agree to ground rules
2.	Miscommunication and project delays can occur from team members who miss key updates	2.	Create and distribute meeting recordings and minutes promptly after each meeting while it is still fresh
3.	Can especially affect hybrid teams if some team members have more clarity than others	3.	Utilize a shared workspace where people can view documents and ask questions



#5 - Technical difficulties

	Symptoms	How to Overcome
1.	Meeting infrastructure is most likely to go down at the worst possible time, such as a critical meeting	Budget for hardware or software solutions, like dedicated bandwidth or a stable, dependable meeting platform
2.	Any problem with meeting software or hardware introduces extra noise or static that can inhibit communication.	Have an IT support person available to diagnose and quickly fix problems
3.	Issues can include delays, impatience, and even some attendees being locked out	Test every new piece of hardware or software before using it in a live meeting

Are you facing network speed issues, particularly these days?



#4 - Time zone differences

	Symptoms	How to Overcome
1.	When team members are distributed across multiple time zones, especially with a difference of six hours or more, finding a common meeting time becomes difficult	 Proactively schedule meetings – whenever possible, share meeting times 1-2 weeks in advance so people can prepare
2.	Someone has to meet outside of normal business hours, which puts additional stress on them, inhibits productivity, and can cause tension	2. Rotate time zones to "share the pain", and also record the meetings and share the recording.
3.	Unfortunately, sometimes little can be done about this	3. Keep meetings concise and to the point to minimize pain



#3 - Cultural or language differences

	Symptoms	How to Overcome
1.	Cultural differences between virtual team members from other countries, or regions within the same country, can cause confusion	 Take advantage of exposure to different cultures and keep an open mind
2.	Not just language differences – many factors can play in such as differences in mannerisms	Take training offered by your organization if it exists
3.	Cultural differences can cause misunderstandings, leading to conflict and delays	3. Use a team charter/ social contract



#6 – Learning Curve

	Symptoms	How to Overcome
1.	People problems including a steep learning curve for hardware or software can cause issues	 Make sure attendees have a resource for learning about the hardware and software including documentation and a support person
2.	If attendees have trouble adjusting to the learning curve, they could miss key items in meetings or be unable to connect	2. Make sure recordings & minutes are readily available for anyone who joins late or is disconnected while meetings are in progress
3.	Differences between technology at home may also come into play	3. Make sure everyone has the same or similar devices and test for inconsistencies in advance



Conclusion

- 1. Due to coronavirus concerns, more people need to work virtually than ever before
- With more people working virtually, more chances for miscues and conflict arise
- Be proactive in preparing and keep an open mind to address issues as they arise
