What Does Agile Maturity Mean?

1. How well your teams are following Agile Principles and Mindset
2. How well your teams are learning and continuously improving
3. How well they are realizing value from being Agile

Why Assess Agile Maturity?

1. Build capability to respond to change
2. Determine opportunities for improvement
3. Track the success of improvement initiatives

**Measure Agile Maturity to fix problems proactively –
You can't improve what you don't measure**

Benefits of Assessing Agile Maturity

1. Greater responsiveness to changes as they arise
2. Higher ROI for investment in Agile transformation
3. Efficiency gains – saving time and money
4. Improved customer satisfaction and team engagement

Benefits of assessment are worth the cost

Core Agile Maturity Measurements

1. Continuous Delivery of Value
2. Responding to Change
3. Self-Organized and Empowered Team
4. Sustainable and High-Quality Development
5. Definition of "Done"
6. Engaging the Customer
7. Continuous Learning
8. Use of Agile Metrics

1. Continuous Delivery of Value



1. Is the team delivering value to the customer frequently? (2 weeks to 1 month)
2. Is Customer satisfaction increasing with each value delivery?
3. Are defects proactively monitored for and resolved quickly?

2. Responding to Change



1. Does the team work on prioritized requirements in order of priority?
2. Does the team welcome changes, even late in the project?
3. Do customers and the team feel empowered to bring changes?

3. Self-Organized and Empowered Team



1. Is the team self-managing and free of command-and-control structures?
2. Are team members focused on and interested in their work?
3. Does the team leader champion a servant-leadership mindset?

4. Sustainable and High-Quality Development



1. Is the team achieving their commitments consistently and with high-quality code and development practices?
2. Are team members achieving their commitment without consistent overtime?
3. Is team performance sustainable?

5. Definition of "Done"



1. Is there a clearly-understood and agreed-on definition of “done”?
2. Is the definition of “done” followed by the team and does it allow the team to deliver production-ready output frequently?
3. Is the definition of “done” re-evaluated as necessary?

6. Engaging the Customer



1. Is the customer highly engaged with the team, providing honest and regular feedback?
2. Does the team prioritize customer needs across the entire project life cycle?
3. Is customer satisfaction the team's highest priority?

7. Continuous Learning



1. Does the team reflect on opportunities for improvement after each iteration?
2. Does the team implement at least one improvement opportunity in each iteration?
3. Does the team use data to demonstrate improvement?

8. Use of Agile Metrics



1. Does the team collect Agile metrics regularly?
2. Does the team collect operational metrics such as velocity and cycle time?
3. Does the team collect business metrics such as increased revenue and cost savings?




